3 REASONS WHY CORPORATE
RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES FALL SHORT

1. Too large

Many corporate retirement communities are designed to accommodate large numbers of residents, and while this is good for areas with a high population of older adults, it makes for a challenging foundation to build a culture of community.

On the other hand, Riddle Village is much smaller than most corporate retirement communities, making it easier for us to foster a sense of community among our residents.

2. Not everyone's needs can always be met

Related to the problem of being too big, in a large retirement community, not everyone's needs can always be met to the level they require. And this is usually because there are simply too many residents, making it more difficult for staff to give residents the time and attention they need.

While every state certainly has its own minimum requirements for resident-tostaff ratios, in smaller retirement communities, it's easier for older adults to have their basic and lifestyle needs accommodated.

3. Treated like a number, rather than a person

Similar to a large university with many students, who have individual ID numbers in the registrar's office and are sorted that way instead of by their names, in a large corporate-owned retirement community, it's more likely you'll be treated like a number rather than a person.
